Our school is in the heart of the city, in the bustling, vibrant area known as the West End. Discover more about culture & Art from around the world by visiting the British Museum, shop for the latest trends on Oxford Street, and try the oriental food at Soho, all within easy walking distance from LSI London Central School. Our classrooms are equipped with excellent facilities for studying English, library and a student lounge.

The LSI Junior Programme includes English language tuition at our London Central school with residential accommodation at Ramsay Hall of University College London (UCL) in single rooms with full board. Additionally, an exciting social programme with regular excursions and fun activities is included. Students will get the chance to practice their English with people from around the world.

What's included?

- Initial placement test and orientation
- English course from Monday to Friday (20 x 50-minute lessons per week) at our London Central school
- Course materials
- Residential accommodation in single rooms with full board at UCL Ramsay Hall
- Guided activity programme
- 5 morning or afternoon activities and 5 evening activities per week from Monday to Friday
- Welcome party on arrival
- 1 full-day Saturday excursion per week

Transfer service	We suggest that students book an LSI taxi to ensure their safe transfer to their accommodation. An LSI representative will be waiting for the student in the arrivals area holding an LSI sign with their name displayed too. For students aged 15 or under, this service is compulsory.
Travelling to school	UCL residence is in walking distance to our London Central school (approximately 10 minutes walk). Students will be accompanied by LSI activity leaders to school every morning.
Travelling to activities**	Students are taken to the activities by LSI activity leaders. Following the activity, the group is brought back to the residence.

The Programme

First Day

On the first day, students should arrive at 9am with their passports. Students will be given an induction which will explain the programme rules and important information regarding living and studying in London.

English lessons

Classes are held from 9.00am – 12.45pm from Monday to Friday.

Students are put into classes according to their English levels. Students will study grammar, vocabulary, conversation skills, pronunciation, reading, and writing. If students have any problems with their classes they can speak with their teacher or Director of Studies, who are happy to support students in their studies.

Class size

Max. 18 students per class.

Class materials

Students need to bring their own notepad/paper and pen. They will be provided with text books and study materials on a loan basis

Attendance

Students are expected to attend all classes and activities unless they are unwell.

LSI Certificate

On completion of the course, students will be presented with an LSI certificate, assuming they have met the attendance requirements.

Internet

Both the school and residence have Wi-Fi for students to use.

Activities

Students will go on morning or afternoon activities and evening activities each week day (Monday to Friday). There is also a full day Saturday excursion each week and a welcome party on the arrival day. There are a variety of activities depending on the weather and student numbers. Individual students are not allowed to drop activities. For groups, no refunds are given for activities they choose not to participate in. Please see the sample timetable below.

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The Programme

Rules for Accommodation

Upon your arrival, you will be shown around the residence and informed of any rules. If you breach any of these rules, a list of possible sanctions will be applied. Please show respect towards the residence rules and the other students within the residence. As a guest, it is expected that you comply with the rules. If you have any disagreements with the rules, please consult the School Director.

Further course information

- **In class**, the focus will mainly be on speaking, listening, vocabulary, and pronunciation skills (with some emphasis on grammar, reading, and writing as well, but the former are the key components). Many lessons will have a London or British theme.

- **Punctuality** is essential for everything! As you will have limited time for activities, please be on time. Remember that if one person is late, everybody waits. Late or absent students will face disciplinary action.

- **Excursions:** Wear appropriate clothing, taking into account the weather conditions. Please ask your teacher for advice. Bring a waterproof jacket if it might rain, and wear sunglasses and sunscreen if it is sunny. Above all, wear comfortable shoes! You will walk a lot during the day, and sore feet can spoil your trip. During excursions, you will have some free time. You will be instructed on how frequently and when to check in with your guide teacher. Stay in groups of two or more. If you don't want to go with another student, you can always accompany the teacher or activity leader.

- **Junior Contract:** On the first day, juniors must sign a contract that includes the procedure for expulsion. A copy of the contract is available upon request. If students are dissatisfied with any aspect of their Junior Programme, we encourage them to contact an LSI staff member as soon as possible so that any concerns can be addressed. A Parent/Guardian Contract must be signed upon enrolling the student. Please get in touch with the school to obtain a copy of the contract. Additionally, we will need 2 passport photos or a high-resolution digital passport-sized photo at the time of enrolment.

Sanctions

The following penalties may be applied if a student is found to have violated the Juniors' Code of Conduct. These penalties may be imposed independently or in combination with other penalties, and can be applied to an individual student, groups of students, or a group leader.

- **Warning** - The student will receive a written or verbal warning, indicating that repetition of the behaviour will result in more severe disciplinary action.
- **Parental or Agent Notification** - A letter, email or telephone call will be sent to the student's parent and/or agent informing them of the student's violation of the Juniors' Code of Conduct.
- **Restitution** - Students will be required to pay for any damages they cause to the school or their homestay accommodation.
- **Fine/Administration Fee** - The student will be required to pay a sum of money as a penalty.
- **Probation** - A period of time during which the student must behave in a manner acceptable to the school. Conditions of probation may be established that restrict the student's participation in activities.
- **Loss of Privilege** - The student may have their access to LSI services, facilities and activities restricted.
- **Suspension** - The student will be excluded from attending classes, participating in activities, and using school facilities for a specified period of time.
- **Dismissal** - The student's school registration, class attendance, activities or accommodation will be terminated. A student who has been dismissed may only be readmitted with the permission of the LSI Director.
- **Expulsion** - The permanent loss of the privilege of registration and class attendance. A student who has been expelled is not eligible for readmission and is not entitled to a refund of fees. The student is responsible for all costs incurred as a result of this decision.
